Ride the Rails

Amtrak Capitol Limited: Daily to Harpers Ferry and Martinsburg.

Amtrak Cardinal: Three days a week to White Sulphur Springs, Alderson, Hinton, Prince, Thurmond, Montgomery, Charleston and Huntington.

Maryland Rail Commuter (MARC): Weekdays to Harpers Ferry, Duffields and Martinsburg.

Roads to Almost Heaven

The state is easily accessible by six interstates. The only toll road is the West Virginia Turnpike, Interstate-77 between Princeton and Charleston.

Electric vehicle charging stations are also available around the state, including free stations located within several state parks.

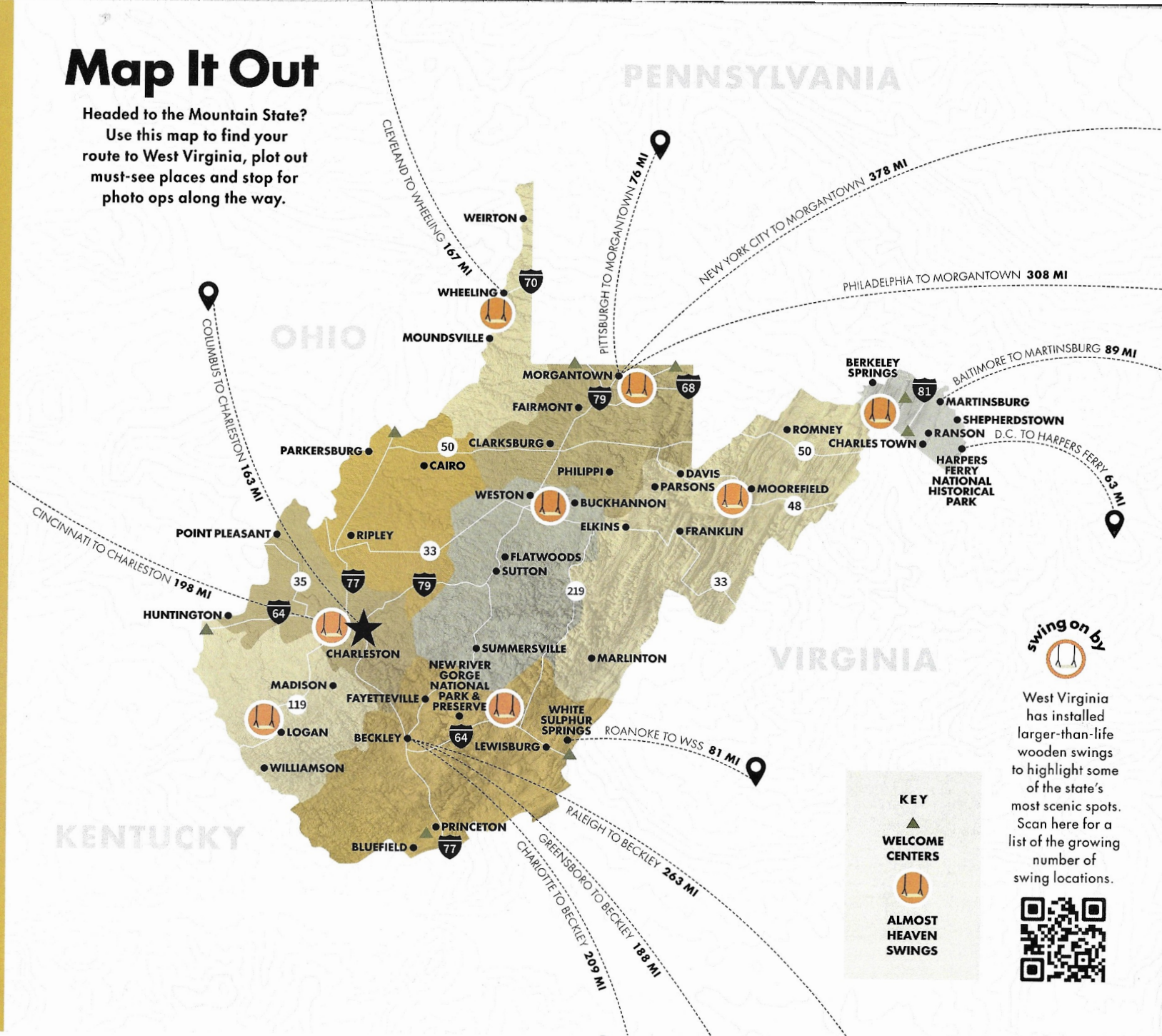
